Matthew 2:2

- Ice cream tubs.
- 2 x large wooden crosses for the Chapels.
- Clipboards.
- 6. Plastic rubbish bins for Chapel (Big and small)
- 7 Tissue bags for chapel.
- Table clothes and Purple cloth for crosses.
- Letter bag with 72 compartments.
- 50 x Plastic sweet bowls / sugar bowls.
