Encouraging Words from Chrysalis SA -Val Nel

In the beginning of another exciting year of Chrysalis, I would like us to reflect on what Chrysalis is and what it means to us all.

We often hear that the youngsters who attend our flights say that their Chrysalis Flight was simply said "a life changing event". But I would go as far as stating that it is not only a life changing event but the moment that our lives are transformed forever.

As a result let us meditate for a moment on what Chrysalis is:

I would like to think that it is a 72-hour journey wandering in the presence the Almighty or simply getting a glimpse of Heaven; surrounded by angels, brothers and sisters in Christ, where everyone from Caterpillars, volunteers and sponsors again have the opportunity to live Christianity at the foot of the Father.

It's from the love and grace we experience at Chrysalis that we are encouraged to obey what Jesus commanded of us in Matt 28:19 "Go forth and make disciples of all nations". Members encourage each other to continue this journey of discipleship, to pray for one another and hold each other accountable for spiritual commitments.

Discipleship is such a 'BIG' word for some of us but in actual fact it is as simple as remembering that YOUR life alone can be the greatest form of discipleship ever preached. We have learned that YOU could be the only Bible that some people will ever get to read.

Together with Emmaus, Chrysalis leaders (youths and adults) and the community, we join in God's mission of renewal, reconciliation and transformation that transpires through His love and grace. It is therefore vital to remember that the purpose of Chrysalis is to support the church's efforts to guide the spiritual formation of Christian youth.

There are many different things that the youngsters attending the Chrysalis weekend will remember, each will have their own special moments, some very different from others. Thus, let us not anticipate what we think these special moments will be but rather have faith that they will experience the Chrysalis – from Caterpillar to beautiful butterfly – and discover what Paul meant when he wrote: 'If anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation; the old has passed away; and everything has become new'. (2 Cor 5:17)

It is not OUR responsibility to make this happen – God will take care of all of that. It is however our duty to allow room for the Holy Spirit to do HIS job.

I would like to consequently encourage you to be obedient to His Spirit and to let Him use you in whichever way, big or small. Remember how vital your role and your place in the community is and in the process of the Chrysalis flight.

Noah built an ARK in obedience to the call of God and it is for that reason our duty to be obedient through building our own ARK (Acts of Random Kindness). I want to encourage you to be the hands and feet of Jesus this coming year. Participate and get involved in your reunion groups. Show Acts of Random Kindness to fellow worshipers but more importantly those who are still in search of the love and grace that can only be found at the foot of the cross.

My prayer for this year is that we as a Chrysalis community will not become a museum for saints but rather a hospital for sinners.

We decided to include a piece out of the manual with each edition for a while so that we all become a bit more familiar with this extremely wise document. Our Board Facilitator (Di Kyle) has undertaken to do so for us. Thanks to her.

Sponsorship

This is probably the most responsible and important job in the Chrysalis movement and it is one shared by adults who have participated in an Emmaus Walk and young people who have taken part in a Chrysalis Flight. It is a way to demonstrate God's outreaching love and reflects how He reaches out to people through other people. Good sponsorship is a living demonstration of agape love and makes Chrysalis an act of sacrificial love from beginning to end – love of God, young people, the Chrysalis movement and the church. Do not consider spiritually sponsoring anyone without lots of prayer, planning and consultation. Ideally youth between the ages of 15 and 25 years, of every race, economic background or denomination, who attend church or youth groups, and anyone who genuinely desires to know more about Christ, is eligible to be sponsored. However, do NOT sponsor youth with no interest in the Christian faith. The Chrysalis Flight is not a quick fix for people undergoing personal trauma. Make sure their parents or guardians are happy that they attend and that the youths themselves have a belief that is compatible with the theology represented in Chrysalis. They must also be committed to attending future events in order to grow the ministry. Poorly sponsored youth are a distraction and detract from the experience for the other participants. What a gift you have within your reach – the gift of spiritually sponsoring someone, allowing them the opportunity to meet with Jesus on their own spiritual flight. Fly with Christ.
